

Part-time Programs 1. If we cancel a course, all your fees

are totally refunded. 2. If you cannot attend a class that has been rescheduled to a time or place other than advertised, you are entitled to a full refund.

3. If you withdraw from a class before the first scheduled class meeting, a full tuition refund, less a withdrawal fee of \$25, will be made after the withdrawal* is requested in writing.

4. If you withdraw after the first scheduled class meeting but before the second class meeting, one-half of the tuition, less a withdrawal fee

of \$25, will be refunded after withdrawal* is requested in writing. **NOTE:** No refunds for any dance or fitness class after the first class begins.

5. All extra costs, such as books or equipment that were not included in tuition price, are not subject to refund.

6. We are unable to provide refunds for requests received after the second scheduled class meeting. Waivers may be granted only under extenuating circumstances which must be detailed in writing within five days of your last day of attendance. If a waiver is granted, it must be used within one calendar year. Decisions to grant waivers are the prerogative of the WS BOCES administrator whose decision is final. 7. Any overpayment accepted will be totally refunded.

8. There is a \$25 fee for all returned checks.

9. Payments made with a credit card will receive refund credit on their credit card, however, any refund made after 120 days will be issued by WS BOCES check regardless of how tuition was paid. NOTE: Every effort is made to provide a timely refund. Processing of refunds may take 45 days after

your first scheduled day of class.





RADIOLOGIC TECHNOLOGY

Effective medical treatment relies on accurate diagnosis, which is why the Radiologic Technologist plays such a key role in healthcare. The technologist is responsible for producing images of the body that will be used to detect injury and diagnose disease. As technology advances, radiology equipment and procedures become more complex, sophisticated and specialized and require the expertise of trained professionals. Students who successfully complete the program are eligible to sit for the American Registry of Radiologic Technologist (ARRT) Radiography Certification Examination. Upon passing the exam, the student becomes a certified and registered Radiologic Technologist, allowing them to practice radiology anywhere in the country. 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
